



Secondary Night School Frequently Asked Questions

Question	Answer
I'm a current high school student. How do I register?	Registration must be done through your MyBlueprint Account
I'm an adult. Is this course for me? If so, how do I register?	These are not General Interest courses. Courses are for students working towards their high school diploma, completing prerequisites for Post-Secondary education, or fulfilling employment requirements. You will be required to participate in all classes (3 absences total,) and complete all tests, quizzes, and the final exam. Credits will be recorded onto your permanent Ontario Student record. Can I register on site on the first day?	No. Registration closes September 18th at 12:00 p.m. Space is limited.
Does the course take place in a classroom?	Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, all classes will be fully online at the times listed on the schedule. There is a possibility that courses may revert back to an in-class model pending Covid-19 developments. In this case, more information will be sent to the students at that time.
What is the cost to take a course?	There is no fee to Ontario residents. Fees may apply for International Students.
How do I get confirmation that my registration was approved?	Due to high numbers, we cannot confirm registration. Please contact your home school to ensure that you are registered.
Can I take more than one course?	You may only take one Night School course at a time.
Is the course guaranteed to run?	Courses are conditional on enrollment. If we do not have enough students to run a class, we will try to combine classes or will contact you to attempt to find another option. Cancellations will be posted on www.garyallan.ca on September 18th, 2020 by 4:00 p.m.. We will not have access to class numbers until that date.
What are the locations and times of the courses?	All courses will be offered online, with the possibility of being converted to in-class, pending Covid-19 developments. Language courses run Wednesdays, 6:30 p.m. - 9:30 p.m. September 23rd - May 5th. All other courses run Monday and Wednesdays, 6:30 p.m.- 9:30 p.m. September 23rd to January 20th
I can't participate in the course every day. Is that okay?	Students may miss a maximum of 3 days. Further absences will result in removal from the program.
Can I start/finish the course early?	No, course schedules cannot be modified.
Can I contact the teacher prior to the course?	Teachers are not assigned to a specific class until the first morning of school because enrollment numbers change drastically up until that time. You may only contact a teacher at this time.
I have an IEP. What do I do with it?	You must email a copy of your IEP to your teacher on the first day.
What if I need to drop out ?	You must request a Drop Form from your teacher. The last day to drop out of the course without the mark showing up on your official record is March 25th, 2020 for full year language classes, and May 4th, 2020 for Semester 2 classes.
Is there an exam?	All courses have a final evaluation. Your teacher will explain all grading criteria in class.
How do I get my final mark?	Report cards will be sent to your home school. If you are an adult, your final report will be mailed to your home address.
How does my university/college get my marks?	If you are a Halton District School Board student, your mark will automatically be uploaded to OUAC/OCAS with your home school upload. If you are from a school outside of the Halton District School Board, please request a 'Marks To University' form from your teacher.
